### Joan of Arc by Mark Twain (1896):

Mark Twain's meticulously researched novel, narrated by a fictional companion, Louis de Conte, traces St. Joan of Arc's extraordinary life. From her mystical visions as a peasant girl in Domrémy, to leading France's armies in the Hundred Years' War, to her tragic trial and martyrdom in 1431, Joan's story shines with faith, humility, and unwavering trust in God. Twain, typically skeptical, crafts a reverent portrait of her sanctity, making this a captivating blend of history and spirituality for Catholic readers.

### The Power and the Glory by Graham Greene (1940):

Graham Greene's masterpiece follows a nameless "whiskey priest" fleeing persecution in 1930s Mexico, where Catholicism is outlawed. A flawed man wrestling with addiction and past sins, he continues to serve his people, offering sacraments amid danger. Through taut prose, Greene explores the tension between human weakness and divine grace, culminating in a powerful meditation on redemption and the enduring call of priesthood.
